

Clayton Named One of America's Coolest Small Towns



In February, 2011, Clayton was named the 3rd Coolest Small Town in America in the annual contest held by Budget Travel Magazine. The Magazine received 80 nominations for cool small towns and selected 20 that "stood out from the crowd." In order to qualify, the towns must have a population under 10,000 and they must be on the upswing—"a place that's beginning to draw attention—and new residents—because of the quality of life, arts and restaurant scene, or proximity to nature." In addition, the contest claims that the towns must be "cool" not " quaint". Budget Travel editors claimed it was the town's historic ship building and its location in the Thousand Islands that attracted them to our small community. Once selected, towns were urged to obtain the most votes through an online voting poll. Clayton received 25,337 votes during the contest, coming in just behind Astoria, Oregon in 2nd and the 1st place winner, Lewisburg, West Virginia. Clayton, along with the other top winners, will be featured in the September issue of Budget Travel Magazine.

Sailing Seaway Clayton Event a Success

In June, tall ship *Lynx* made its way to Clayton, New York – the smallest port stop of 2011 for the ship - for the first-time ever and was the featured vessel during the first-year event, *Sailing Seaway Clayton*. Prior to the ship's arrival, all ten public sailing excursions were sold out - an accomplishment that no other port on the ship's 2011 summer calendar had reached to date. In all, more than 400 people would sail aboard *Lynx* during its time in the Thousand Islands. In addition to sold out excursions, the event drew more than 1,000 visitors on board the ship for deck tours and over 5,000 people to Frink Park over the course of seven days to view the ship in port. The village of Clayton kicked-off the event on Tuesday, June 14 with nearly 750 people in the park on a windy, over-cast afternoon that saw temperatures in the low 50s as the ship made its way up the St. Lawrence River.



On Sunday, June 19, a total of more than 250 people took deck tours in just three hours, setting the single-day event record. *Sailing Seaway Clayton* recently announced that the event will continue for at least the next two years at Frink Park. The 2012 edition is expected to commemorate the War of 1812 bicentennial. A tall ship for that event has yet to be announced. Tall ship *Lynx* will return for the event in 2013 to be the featured vessel once again. Downtown Projects are Booming

Since the announcement in February 2010 that the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation considered the environmental remediation of the former Frink America property complete the Town and Village of Clayton and the Clayton Local Development Corporation have been working diligently to return that 8-acre parcel along the St. Lawrence River back to productive use, including a 1,254 foot long "Riverwalk" dedicated to public use in perpetuity. Although at first glance it may not look as if much is happening, the Town, Village and CLDC have been working behind the scenes with the land developer to design a project that will positively influence our local economy while also aligning with our community's essence and vision. At the same time, community members and visitors alike are able to enjoy the results of our first Riverwalk grant, funded through the NYS Department of State. This grant funded the construction of the initial phase of the Riverwalk (from Jane Street to Riverside Drive at Frink Park) and the installation of several benches along the walkway. A second DOS grant has been received which will include funding for improvements to the shoreline along the former Frink property, stairs and a handicapped ramp to future docks, and other site amenities including lighting



along the Riverwalk, trash receptacles, and landscaping. A NYS Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation grant has also been received to fund the construction of several overlooks off the Riverwalk on the Frink site. U.S. Fish & Wildlife has also awarded a Boating Infrastructure Grant (BIG) for the construction of a transient docking facility (staying overnight 1-10 days) to include 50 dock slips and the construction of a wave attenuator (essentially a "breakwater" which will also provide dock space for larger vessels). Even more, the Village of Clayton is working with the CLDC to administer a NYS Department of State grant for Frink Park which includes funding to complete Phase 2 of the Riverwalk project (from Frink Park to the Veteran's Monument) and the construction of a shaded viewing area/performance area in Frink Park. *If you have questions about any of these ongoing projects, contact the CLDC office at 315-686-3512, extension 26.*

Charles Solar Honored

On June 16, 2011, Charles Solar of Clayton, New York was honored for his commitment to the community. A 70-year member of the Clayton Volunteer Fire Department (serving as a firefighter, councilman, and as a fire policeman), former DPW Superintendent for the Village, and the very first named Citizen of the Year in 1971, Mr. Solar was named Honorary Dockmaster of the Thousand Islands Regional Dock at a ceremony during the "Sailing Seaway Clayton" event held in the Village of Clayton and was presented with a Resolution by the Town of Clayton, awarding him the community status of "Outstanding Citizen" for his dedicated and outstanding service to the Clayton Community.

Town of Clayton Completes Solar Projects

The Town of Clayton has expressed its support of energy efficiency measures across our community. This support includes passing an Energy Efficiency resolution in 2010 and providing letters of support for several private projects in our community. Additionally, the Town completed a pool renovation project at its Cerow Recreation Park facility in 2010 which included the purchase of a *pool cover* with a storage reel system to significantly reduce the energy necessary for heating the pool water. Since then, the Town has also funded the installation of a *solar thermal system* at the facility to heat domestic (showers and hand washing) and pool water—again, reducing the energy necessary from electricity and fuel oil. This system also heats the me-



chanical room which significantly reduces the need for other forms of energy. At the Cerow Park Arena, 2011 saw the installation of a total of *44kWh photovoltaic solar array* on the roof. And, a *35kWh photovoltaic solar array* was also installed on roof of the joint Town/Village of Clayton Highway Department. The photovoltaic solar arrays were funded through grants by NYSERDA. The project consultant was Fourth Coast, Inc., a Clayton-based company offering municipal and commercial consulting and design and installation of customized renewable energy products. New NYS DEC Burning Restrictions

As of October 14, 2009, the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation has initiated new rules regarding open burning. Burning trash is now prohibited statewide. The exceptions to the open burning rules include the right to have campfires less than 3' high by 4' in length, width or diameter; small cooking fires; and ceremonial or celebratory bonfires. TIERS to Launch Two New Projects

Thousand Islands Emergency Rescue Service (TI-Rescue) is working on two important projects in the 2011 season for our elderly population and students seeking a Paramedic degree at JCC. TI-Rescue recently received the licensing and authority to operate a wheelchair van so they may begin transporting our elderly area residents to and from doctor's appointments. This van was recently donated to TI-Rescue from River Hospital.

In August, TI-Rescue is launching an innovative project in cooperation with Fort Drum Regional Health Planning Organization and Jefferson Community College. TI-Rescue is to offer a candidate attending the JCC Paramedic Program a scholarship and essentially "free room and board" for taking 24 hours of "call" each week. The candidate must be a NYS Emergency Medical Technician enrolled in the Paramedic Program at JCC. The student who enters the program will get a dorm style room with a bed, dresser, desk, refrigerator and free laptop computer. The student will have access to kitchen facilities and the amenities as other members of TI-Rescue currently receive and will become a volunteer member of TI-Rescue for a period of 18 months. During the program duration the student will be working and receiving on the job training by TI-Rescue career Paramedics and Administrative staff as well as other members of the organization. The goal of the program will be to groom a local student to graduate and become a career Paramedic with TI-Rescue or another agency in the North County. TI-Rescue's administration has been working with Fort Drum Regional Health Planning Organization to expand the Paramedic Student Bunk-in Program to be offered by other EMS agencies throughout the North County.
