A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE SEQR FOR THE TOWN OF CLAYTON TRANSIENT DOCKING FACILITY.
DATED: APRIL 23, 2014

Title: A resolution approving the SEQR for the Town of Clayton Transient Docking Facility.

At a regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Clayton, Jefferson County, New York held at the Town Offices, 405 Riverside Drive, Clayton, New York, on April 23, 2014, at 5:00 PM prevailing time:

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor Taylor and upon roll being called the following were:

The following was offered by Christopher D. Matthews, and seconded by Mary Zovistoski, to wit,

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Clayton has completed the Short Environmental Form for the Project of the Transient Docking Facility, and

WHEREAS, the Town stated that this includes the installation of a transient docking facility and wave attenuator on the northeast corner of the Village of Clayton, and

WHEREAS, the Town has acknowledged that the wave attenuator will be approximately 300 feet in length and 12 feet wide, consisting of vertical circular piles at a maximum diameter of 16". Alternatively, batter piles may be installed for lateral support. The attenuator will include a sewer pump out, electricity, potable water, and handicap accessibilities and accommodate 3 vessels,

WHEREAS, the floating docks are intended to accommodate 49 vessels, consisting of two main docks, which include 23 "fingers". The docks are intended to include electricity, potable water, and handicap accessibility. The floating docks are to be anchored utilizing approximately 29, 6" piles,

WHEREAS, this project also includes a 550 sq. ft. boaters services building, abutment to docks, overlooks, and other riverwalk amenities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Town Board of the Town of Clayton has determined that based on the information and analysis of the SEQRA, and any supporting documentation, that the proposed action will not result in any significant adverse environmental impacts,
